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**National Petroleum Council to Deliver Findings
on Infrastructure Permitting and Gas-Electric Coordination**

Future Energy Systems Report to Address Unprecedented Energy Demand Growth

WASHINGTON, D.C., November 19, 2025—The National Petroleum Council (NPC) next month will release key findings and recommendations to reform oil and natural gas infrastructure permitting and gas-electric coordination in response to Energy Secretary Chris Wright's request earlier this year.
